“Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, and you shall be saved.” (Acts 16:30,31)
It’s that simple!
Admit that you are a sinner.
Believe that Jesus died in your place so that you could be forgiven of all your sin.
The day is going to come when each person will stand before God. The Bible says,
“Each one of us shall give account of himself to God.” (Romans 14:12)
Will you stand there with your debt or will God be able to pronounce, “Paid in full”? There is only one Savior—Jesus Christ.
